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CVS Abortion Pill Protest

On Saturday, June 13, 2026, a group of pro-lifers stood outside of the CVS store in Mineola to protest that CVS Pharmacy fills prescriptions for mifepristone for chemical abortion. The pro-lifers also oppose Walgreens having made the same decision to sell the 'abortion pill' drug. Walgreens is across the street from this CVS location, so customers and others saw the pro-lifers' signs explaining their presence, including the large message: Choose Life for the Unborn Babies.



Abortion Pill /Chemical Abortion Primer

The abortion method commonly called 'abortion pill' is actually a two-drug regimen to end a pregnancy by killing the developing in-utero human. The abortion pill has been approved by the FDA to be taken up to the 10th week of pregnancy. Since they are often prescribed or purchased online without any physical verification of the gestational age, as well as being promoted by Planned Parenthood as "Just in case" pills for future possible pregnancies, the abortion pills are sometimes used past the 10-week limit. Chemical abortion has two steps:

Step One: The mother swallows mifepristone pills (the 'abortion pill' or RU-486). Mifepristone blocks the action of the hormone progesterone, thus causing the lining of the uterus to break down, cutting off oxygen and vital nutrients to the embryo, who then dies in the woman's womb.

Step Two: 24-48 hours after taking mifepristone, the woman places misoprostol pills in her cheeks. This drug initiates labor-like contractions to force the embryo/fetus out of her uterus. During this process, she may experience cramping and bleeding that can be very intense and painful, and may last a few hours to several days. The embryo could be lost anytime/anywhere during this process, but the woman will often sit on a toilet as she expels the embryo, and then she will generally flush the remains down the toilet.

There are many risks to a chemical abortion, not the least of which is that it may not be successful or complete, yet the woman may not be aware of that or that she has an ectopic pregnancy (e.g., in the fallopian tube) which is life-threatening and not affected by these abortion-inducing drugs.

Abortion Pill Reversal

Abortion Pill Reversal (APR) is a medical intervention with progesterone that has been developed to reverse the effects of mifepristone if started within 72 hours after that drug was taken and misoprostol has not been taken. While not always successful, thousands of babies have been born by women who regretted taking the abortion pill, contacted the abortion pill reversal hotline in time and proceeded with the APR protocol. Street Fair Conversation – How abortion supporters dodge the main point

While at the Long Island Coalition for Life booth at a recent street fair, my conversation below gives a glimpse into how those embedded in the abortion culture are at ease jumping past pro-life talking points rather than engaging in them.

As the young lady (in her early 20s) walked past eyeing the LICL booth, I extend my hand, offering a card. She brushes me off with a smirk: "I'm a lesbian, I don't get abortions." I quickly reply, lesbians can still care about killing, showing her the card with an 8-week embryo picture.

Her - Switch #1: That's not me, I was an IVF baby.

Me: You were still a baby. I talk about inherent value as a human.

Her - Switch #2: After my suicide attempt, that's when I wanted to live. People only have value when they want to live.

Me (after acknowledging her life trauma): Is it okay to kill a newborn? They can't decide if they have value and a will to live. Where would you draw the line?

Her - Switch #3: My mom had a hard time after I was born, maybe better if she didn't have a kid. Some women die from pregnancy.

Me: I explain pro-life opposition to induced abortion, not interventions for actual 'life of the mother.' I give the example of ectopic pregnancy.

Her: That sounds like abortion to me.

Me: I strongly push back on that, letting her know that a woman who loses a baby through miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy or the like is heartbroken; don't tell her she had an abortion.

Her - Switch #4: I don't like it when people compare abortion to suicide.

Me: I told her I hadn't ever heard that; doesn't make sense and isn't right. (By this time, she was probably grasping at anything to stop me.) As she moved away, I encouraged her for improving her life and wished her well.

This conversation is sad on a number of levels, one of them being how earnestly or glibly many abortion advocates circle around every point brought up about respecting life in the womb. Regardless, the pro-life community has to reach and engage abortion cheerleaders whether we think they'll listen to us or not. [Celeste Broyles]

FEDERAL LEGISLATION

The 2025 “Big Beautiful Bill” defunded Planned Parenthood of \$600M in Medicaid funds. This defund expired July 4. Pro-lifers urged Speaker Johnson to

extend the defund. He proposed bills under the Reconciliation process (versions 2.0 and 3.0) that contained a PP defund, but the defund was later removed from both versions. There are rumors of version 4.0, as the Senate seemed likely to recess for vacation without passing version 3.0. The Reconciliation process can only address funding issues and needs just 51 Senate votes to pass.

On July 30, LifeNews.com reported that PP sued the Trump administration after it was announced that this is the last year PP will receive Title X grants. Pro-lifers have said the change would finally end taxpayer support for PP. The lawsuit challenges HHS’ revised notice of funding opportunity for the 2027-2032 grant cycle. Title X provides grants for contraception, pregnancy testing, STI screenings and other family planning services for lower-income patients. Federal law bars the funds from being used for abortions. Pro-lifers have long stated that awarding grants to PP and other abortion corporations still subsidizes the abortion industry by freeing other revenue for abortions. The new funding priorities emphasize family formation, healthy pregnancies and natural family planning methods such as fertility tracking, while screening applicants for alignment with administration policies. PP’s complaint argues the changes require applicants “to align with certain political positions such as favoring fertility tracking over contraceptives and are based on HHS’ current political and ideological differences rather than the program’s statutory purpose.”

Kristan Hawkins, founder of Students for Life of America, has been urging the Trump administration to end mailing of the abortion pill by enforcing the 1873 Comstock Act, and to get the FDA to ban mifepristone. Elise Winland at Zeale reported (8/4/26) that Acting Attorney General Todd Blanche told faith leaders during a recent private call that the DOJ is working to make the *Dobbs* decision “permanent in every single state...if states have said, ‘We are going to protect the unborn, and we’re going to protect every life from the moment of conception,’ we’re putting practices and policies in place so that other states and other organizations can’t attack that, and they can’t do things like mail order drugs...we will have victory, and victory will be soon, and it will be permanent.” Organizers said the call was not intended for “press purposes or on the record.”

After Louisiana sued the FDA in Oct. 2025, the DOJ asked the Supreme Court to keep the FDA’s existing rules in place (allowing remote prescriptions and mail distribution of mifepristone) while the FDA conducts an ongoing review. LifeNews.com reported on 6/25/26 that some members of Congress have been told the FDA’s safety review will be completed by September.

On 5/15/26, the Supreme Court declined to immediately restore an in-person requirement for a prescription while the lawsuit continues in lower courts. The DOJ also moved in March 2026 to dismiss or pause a separate lawsuit brought by Missouri, Idaho and Kansas that seeks to restore the ‘safeguards’ on mifepristone. In April 2026, a

coalition of 78 pro-life groups urged the DOJ to stop opposing state challenges to the FDA’s abortion drug policies.

On July 22, all 259 Congressional Democrats (47 US Senators and 212 House members) filed a friend-of-the-court brief asking the 5th US Circuit Court of Appeals to deny Louisiana’s request to pause the FDA’s 2023 rule change that lifted regulations on mifepristone, allowing certified pharmacies to dispense it and permitting the drug to be shipped rather than provided in person. The lawmakers stated that eliminating the in-person requirement was based on “scientific evidence” and that Louisiana’s proposed nationwide restriction is “onerous.”

A peer-reviewed study published 7/20/26 in the *Journal of the Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine* found “significant” concentrations of the abortion drug mifepristone in the water supply of 3 US cities. The study showed that conventional water treatment “was not effective for removing” mifepristone’s endocrine disrupting compound (EDC) from the water in all the cities the researchers tested. The authors attributed the most probable source of mifepristone in the water from “fecal and urinary excretion by women ingesting mifepristone for chemical abortion.”

Over 50 GOP lawmakers have asked acting AG Todd Blanche for a full probe of the ‘DC 5’ late-term aborted babies recovered at Cesare Santangelo’s D.C. abortuary. His medical license lapsed in June and hasn’t been renewed.

In June, the HHS moved to end the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program, which paid PP and others \$67M to lower teen pregnancy and STD rates, via “evidence-based programs.” since pregnancy rates were the same or went up.

MOMS.GOV, an HHS website, went live 5/10/26, to “address the needs of mothers and fathers who face difficult or unexpected pregnancies and ensuring the wellbeing of mothers and the health of American families.”



NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATION

The Medical Aid in Dying Act (MAID) took effect in NYS on Aug. 5. When the Netherlands first legalized euthanasia in

2002, the focus was on competent adults with unbearable suffering. Over the years, each expansion was defended as being exceptional. Each was presented as narrowly tailored. Each was described as compassionate. NY’s law is not identical to the Dutch system. Yet, once society accepts the idea that physicians may intentionally end their patients’ lives, future debates become arguments over who else should qualify. (newyorkfamilies.org)

On June 11, the End Assisted Suicide Coalition filed suit vs. the NYS MAID law, saying it made “the disabled” 2nd class citizens who will get poison, not proper medical care. In July, several Catholic medical providers and religious orders, including the DRVC, filed suit against the law. A judge temporarily shielded them from the law, and they will not be forced to cooperate with it until a judge rules on *Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm v. James*. NYS wants the Catholic organizations to inform patients about MAID, and direct patients to outside providers of MAID or be subject to fines, license revocation or possible jail time.

Bioethicists promote Terminal Sedation (TS) for People Committing Suicide by Starvation (VSED)

Wesley J. Smith's May 25, 2026, article at National Review reported on a paper in the journal *Bioethics* dated May 19, 2026, in which the authors - Gilbertson, Wilkinson, and Savulescu – argued that when a patient decides to commit suicide by self-starvation and dehydration (VSED – voluntary stop eating and drinking), doctors should be able to 'terminally sedate' the individual if necessary to prevent extreme suffering. Very often those committing VSED are not terminally ill. Smith points out that euthanasia organizations promote VSED to the elderly who are not dying so that they can become eligible for assisted suicide - where it is legal – as a result of becoming 'terminal' due to starvation!

VSED is not the same as dying patients who stop eating. Smith explains that is a natural process as the organs shut down and can no longer assimilate food. VSED, on the other hand, deprives the body of the sustenance needed to remain alive with the intent of causing death – a method of suicide. Smith states, "Without palliation, many people attempting VSED would abandon the attempt. The bioethicists know this and claim that once the decision to commit suicide is made, doctors are duty-bound to medically ameliorate the suffering that inevitably results." The authors insisted this is not assisted suicide. Smith contends it is precisely that. He explains that most of the people undertaking VSED are not dying and "palliation permits the patient to complete the suicide that would otherwise be abandoned. Hence the palliating doctor is facilitating the patient in becoming dead, i.e., it is a form of suicide assistance." The authors even acknowledged that "there may be some cases in which combining [VSED and TS] could amount to assistance in suicide."

The authors listed criteria for allowing VSED with TS. Smith responded that "strict restrictions rarely stay strict... The same kind of slippage would happen if sedating people committing VSED were allowed. Eventually such drugging would become a standard technique, its availability amplified by assisted suicide advocates." Smith states that he reports on these issues because "Articles in professional journals are a means of constructing future public policy and people need to be warned about what is being planned before it is imposed from on high. Or to put it another way, these issues are too important to be left to the bioethicists."

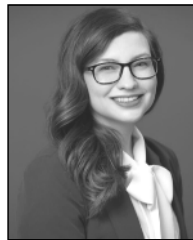

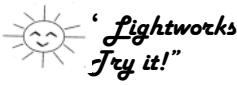

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Face the Truth

As many people continued 'America 250' celebrations on the holiday weekend, more than 50 dedicated pro-lifers took part in the Long Island Coalition for Life's Face the Truth event on July 5 in Lake Grove. This public outreach saw teens and

The LICL thanks those who came and we continue to ask pro-lifers to sustain these public witness events in the future.
