## "CHOOSE LIFE" LICENSE PLATE FRAME

Florida, where the plate has been available to motorists since the year 2000, has raised over \$3 million for pregnancy care centers, maternity homes and nonprofit adoption agencies.

In New York State the Department of Motor Vehicles (NYSDMV) continues to block a "Choose Life"

In 2001, the Children First Foundation (CFF) was founded in Scarsdale, NY by Elizabeth and Charles Rex to support and promote adoption in crisis pregnancies. In addition, CFF supports the Safe Haven program that allows a mother to leave an unwanted newborn at a hospital or fire or police station. CFF sponsors the plate in Connecticut and is trying to sponsor it in New Jersey.

The CFF is working to reverse the NYSDMV decision. The NYSDMV rejected the CFF's design of a crayon drawing of a yellow sun behind the faces of two

smiling children, claiming a significant segment of the population would consider the design "patently offensive" because it also included the words "Choose Life". The CFF revised its design by adding the organization's web site address, fundadoption.org, to better reflect its purpose. The design was rejected again on the same grounds.

On 1/04/05 a federal judge refused to dismiss a civil rights lawsuit brought against NYS officials for excluding a pro-adoption group, the CFF, from its specialty license plate program. As of 10/05/05, CFF awaits a decision so that further steps can be taken to obtain a "Choose Life" plate for NYS.

On August 4, 2004, NYSDMV notified CFF that it was suspending its organizational plate program and no new applications are accepted for new organizational plates.

As the CFF continues the battle for a NY and NJ Choose Life plate, the sale of which would result in significant donations for pro-life efforts, CFF is making available to NYS pro-lifers a license plate frame on which is printed with the words "Choose Life", the boy/ girl logo and "1-877-FUND-ADOPTION" the toll free number to CFF.

## Keeping Tabs on Planned Parenthood Federation in Your School

A parent of a Nassau student was concerned enough with Planned Parenthood's visits to her local school district that she decided to do something about it and called the LI Coalition for Life for assistance. The parent and Johanna and Larry Cervellino, of our Committee to Challenge Planned Parenthood, met with school officials. The school officials were informed of Planned Parenthood's agenda and history of not reporting sexual abuse of minors who are sexually exploited, as well as the school district's responsibilities under state regulations pertaining to health, AIDS instruction, and the school's legal liability if it refers students to Planned Parenthood. At the end of the meeting, the parent was appointed as a member of the school district's Advisory Council on AIDS Instruction. New York State requires every school district to have such a council, which is to be composed of parents, board members, school personnel, and representatives from religious organizations (NYS Reg 135.3).

As a parent of a school-age child and/or a school district taxpayer, you can and should involve yourself in school district policies. While teachers and administrators are there to help educate our children, sometimes we need to teach the administrators. Don't be cowed into thinking you cannot approach superintendents, school board members or principals with information on Planned Parenthood, the country's largest abortionist. Planned Parenthood has absolutely no qualms about reaching into every possible aspect of our children's lives and we must counteract that whenever and wherever possible.

# FEDERAL LEGISLATION AN IMMORTAL LEGACY

Recently deceased Chief Justice William Rehnquist was one of the two minority votes cast against Roe vs. Wade in 1973 which legalized abortion on demand, however, the reasoning he employed is most instructive for all who seek to overthrow that decision.

Justice Rehnquist maintained "The Court's doctrine on abortion is more appropriate to a legislative judgment than a judicial one."

In 1992 he urged the Court "to abandon Roe vs. Wade and leave the matter in the hands of elected law makers." The justice further stated, "Our constitutional watch does not cease merely because we have spoken before on the issue (Roe vs. Wade). When it becomes clear that a prior constitutional interpretation is unsound we are obliged to reexamine the question... Otherwise the most outlandish constitutional decision could survive forever." Chief Justice William Rehnquist has left us a legacy for a fundamental overthrow of Roe vs. Wade. We pray that his wisdom and forthrightness will be carried on by recent and future appointments to the high court. May he rest in peace.

### SEEK REMOVAL OF 18 PROFESSORS

The Catholic Newman Society, CNS, has broadcast a letter calling for the removal of 18 Catholic college professors who have backed abortion and supported the euthanasia starvation of Terri Schiavo. "It is for us to raise our voices in defense of the truth and demand that the authentic truth be brought back to our beloved colleges and universities," wrote Eugene Diamond, former president of the Catholic Medical Association, in a contribution to the CNS letter. The professors listed were from Boston College, Georgetown U., the U. of San Francisco, Santa Clara, Loyola, Marymount U., Marquette U., U. of Notre Dame and Seattle U. Locally, Marymount Manhattan College of N.Y. was disaffiliated with the Catholic church when it allowed pro-abortion Senator Hillary Clinton to deliver the commencement speech there. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops adopted by a vote of 183-6 a statement which calls on Catholic colleges and universities to not give a platform to elected officials who back abortion.

### NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATION



During the next year the biotechnology companies and institutions will continue to lobby for taxpayer funding of unproven embryonic stem cell research (ESCR), including so-called "therapeutic" human cloning. However, in contrast to the hundreds of successes using adult stem cells, there have been no human successes in the use of embryonic stem cells. Yet, nearly all of what we hear from the so-called mainstream press and biotech industries is the promise of embryonic stem cell research.

Despite this, in a New York statewide survey on 45% of respondents would support creation of a stem-cell research institute in New York similar to the \$3 billion initiative approved by the voters in California.

BUT, the biotech industry is prepared to spend additional millions of dollars to promote ESCR taxpayer funding. It will take a gigantic effort to defeat such funding. The N.Y.S. Assembly has twice passed legislation to fund embryonic stem cell research legislation. Either or both the Senate and Assembly could be called back to vote in Special Session before the end of 2005.

**ACTION-Sample Message:** 

I urge you to SUPPORT legislation banning all human cloning S. 2139/A.4855 and to OPPOSE any funding of embryonic stem cell research such as S. 5714, S.5932 and S.433A. After more than twenty years of research, embryonic stem cells have yet to produce a single successful treatment. Meanwhile, adult stem cells found in umbilical cord blood, circulating blood, fat, and various other tissues are currently being used to treat genetic diseases in children, spinal cord injury, heart attack (and heart injury damage), blindness diabetes, Crohn's disease, Systemic Lupus, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, Sickle-Cell Anemia and other diseases. Adult stem cell research results in cures without the destruction of human life. Promotion of embryonic stem cells as "the best hope" for a cure to human suffering is dishonest, irresponsible and cruel to suffering individuals and their families who are searching for hope. ### HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT THE UNBORN CHILD – A COMMODITY



A September 17, 2005 article published on the Zenit News Agency website (www.zenit.org) illustrates how far society has come in terms of refusing to acknowledge the dignity and sanctity of the unborn child's life. The article, entitled Babies – Bought, Sold and Traded - A Dark Side of the Consumer Mind-set, states "Unborn children are increasingly being treated like consumer products, if recent news stories are an indication."

The London-based Times carried a story in early September on the Institute for Problems of Cryobiology and Cryomedicine of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine. The Institute sells baby parts. Its website contains a list of available cells and tissues. The Institute claims that the "material" comes from "fetuses aborted at an early stage of life". The Times article states, however, that "live newborn babies have been disappearing from maternity wards in the city of Kharkov." An exemployee of the Institute stated that the Ukraine had a "more relaxed approach to ethical issues... Ukrainian law considers that babies born before 27 weeks and weighing less than 1 kilogram (2.2 pounds) are automatically considered abortions. As such, the babies are not officially registered, and are sometimes taken away from their mothers and not returned." On April 17, 2005, the British Observer reported that Ukrainian women "were being paid to sell their fetuses to clinics. The tissues are then used for beauty treatments that purportedly rejuvenate the skin and cure diseases." The women were paid about 100 pounds (about \$182) for a fetus. These were then sold in Russia for up to 5,000 pounds (about \$9,100).

In early September, the Canadian Medical Association published an article warning that "women are being encouraged to donate fresh, as opposed to 'surplus' frozen embryos left over from previous in-vitro fertilization treatments to create stem cells." The article also warned "that women might be decreasing their chances of getting pregnant in the future". The authors of the CMA article also stated that on June 7, the Canadian Institutes of Health Research changed the rules so that 'fresh' human embryos could be used for stem cell research. Two days later, Dr. Andras Nagy, a Toronto researcher, announced that his team "was not only working with fresh embryos but had already used them to create Canada's first human embryonic stem cells." Jeffrey Nisker, co-chair of the now-disbanded Health Canada's advisory committee on reproductive technology stated, "Never for one moment did [the committee] imagine that a woman would

ever be approached to give up a fresh embryo." He also "thinks that physicians who ask women to donate fresh embryos might be breaking the medical code of ethics." Ian Wilmut, the creator of 'Dolly the Sheep' was quoted in the Scottish newspaper *Herald* on September 8<sup>th</sup>. He argued that embryonic stem cell research is more ethical since it saves animals from being used in research. He stated that "potentially many thousands of animals" could be saved if human embryos were created and cloned and used in research on incurable diseases. He "recently applied for a license to use embryonic stem cells to develop a cure for ALS – Lou Gehrig's disease.

An April 29th article in the Washington Post reported on a survey of 3,000 parents of children with Down Syndrome. The survey was published in the American Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology. It found that "health professionals who do prenatal screening commonly give negative depictions to parents of the consequences of bearing a child with this problem. The author of the Washington Post article was Brian Skotko, a Harvard medical student. He explained that individuals with Down Syndrome are no longer confined to institutions. They now tend to live in the community. Their life expectancy has increased dramatically due to better medical care. However, an article by George Neumayr in the American Spectator reported that more than 80% of babies currently diagnosed with Down Syndrome during prenatal testing are now aborted. There was also a very high rate of abortion for unborn children with cystic fibrosis. According to Neumayr, "since the 1960's, the number of Americans with anencephaly and spina bifida has markedly declined. This drop corresponds to the rise of prenatal screening." He also referred to the increased risk of medical malpractice suits for doctors who do not warn mothers about their "fetuses' defects". According to the publication Medical Malpractice Law & Strategy, "Court rulings across the country are showing that the increased use of genetic testing has substantially exposed physicians' liability for failure to counsel patients about hereditary disorders."

But perhaps the most depressing example of how far society has fallen comes from an article in the April 17<sup>th</sup> edition of the London *Sunday Times* by author Brenda Power. An Irish couple adopted a child while they were living in Indonesia. The couple had not been able to have their own child. However, two years later they "managed to have a child of their own". When they returned to Ireland, they left the 3 year old adopted child at an orphanage. Power stated that the orphanage had a "consumer-friendly returns policy".

These are the consequences of denying the dignity and sanctity of life at its very beginning.


